ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

CENTRAL—WAN CHAI BYPASS AND ISLAND EASTERN CORRIDOR LINK

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has ordered under sections 17(1)(a) and 17(1)(b) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close temporarily sections of the existing elevated carriageways, at-grade carriageways, footpaths, central medians/refuge islands and amenity areas and to reclaim temporarily the Government foreshore and sea-bed within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. 92995/GAZ/1000 to 92995/GAZ/1008 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, and as amended by Amendment Plans Nos. 92995/GAZ/1000A, 92995/GAZ/1005A to 92995/GAZ/1008A ('the Amendment Plans') and described in the first amendment scheme annexed thereto, and as secondly amended as described in the second amendment scheme and shown on the Plan for Creation of Easements and Permanent Rights No. HKM10389 ('the Easements Plan'), and as thirdly amended by Further Amendment Plans Nos. 92995/GAZ/1000B and 92995/GAZ/1001A ('the Further Amendment Plans') and described in the further amendment scheme annexed thereto, and as fourthly amended by 2020 Amendment Plans Nos. 92995/GAZ/1000C and 92995/GAZ/1007B ('the 2020 Amendment Plans') and described in the 2020 amendment scheme annexed thereto. The Plans and scheme were referred to in G.N. 4767 published on 27 July 2007 and 3 August 2007. The Amendment Plans and the first amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 8202 published on 5 December 2008 and 12 December 2008. The second amendment scheme and the Easements Plan were referred to in G.N. 3775 published on 14 June 2019 and 21 June 2019. The Further Amendment Plans and the further amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 6266 published on 11 October 2019 and 18 October 2019. The 2020 Amendment Plans and the 2020 amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 5375 published on 25 September 2020 and 30 September 2020. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that from 8 January 2021 to 7 January 2022, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing elevated carriageways, at-grade carriageways, footpaths, central medians/refuge islands and amenity areas to be temporarily closed and the Government foreshore and sea-bed to be temporarily reclaimed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the remaining works in relation to the dual three-lane road tunnel between Rumsey Street Flyover in Central and Island Eastern Corridor in North Point, the associated approach roads, slip roads, footpaths and ancillary works including the construction of central medians/refuge islands, roundabout and amenity areas and drainage and landscaping works.

The works to be carried out in association with the reclamation involve the reinstatement of existing sea-bed.

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected elevated carriageways, at-grade carriageways, footpaths, central medians/refuge islands, amenity areas as well as the Government foreshore and sea-bed on 24 December 2020.

Any person entitled to compensation under the Ordinance may serve upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing a written claim, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure, extinction, modification or restriction:—

Personal Information Collection Statement
